



# Do You Have A Child with ADHD?

Researchers at the National Institute of Mental Health are comparing Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder to Bipolar Disorder by investigating brain function and irritability in children.

Researchers will describe the moods and behaviors of children and investigate brain function and irritability. Participation includes interviews, research testing, and brain imaging.

Children with an ADHD diagnosis may be eligible to participate in 2 outpatient day visits to the NIH Clinical Center in Bethesda, MD.

- ◆ Currently recruiting ages 9 - 17
- ◆ ADHD participants must be:
  - Medically healthy
  - Free of bipolar disorder or any mood or other psychiatric disorder that requires treatment

*All evaluations, research procedures and visits are free of cost. This study enrolls locally and travel expenses are paid. Parent and child must agree to the child's participation and both are compensated for participation.*
